Child Passenger Safety Week: September 15 - 21, 2013



Car crashes are the leading cause of death for children 1 to 13 years old.

Many times death and injuries can be prevented by proper use of car seats, booster seats, and seat belts that are used every time you drive.

Sponsored by the National Highway Traffic Association, Child Passenger Safety Week starts September 15 and culminates with National Seat Check Saturday on September 21. Safety Reminder: Gator Game Days 101—Open Container Law

Fall Saturdays in Gainesville mean sweating in the Swamp, Gator parties, and tailgating. Gator game days are here again—time to review the open container law for Football Saturdays and every day of the week in Gainesville.

Carrying an open alcohol container or an alcoholic drink of any kind on the sidewalks, streets, or public parking lots in Gainesville is against the law. This applies to both locals and visitors alike—ignorance of the law is no excuse.

Pass the information along to local family, and friends, and those who may be visiting from out of town. If you are caught by a police officer with an open container of any kind (even if you are only holding it for a friend) on the street, sidewalk, a public parking lot, or off private property, you can either be issued a Notice to Appear before a local judge or taken to jail.

> There is one exception to this law. It is legal to drink at your tailgating spot on the UF campus as long as you don't step outside the parking lot with a drink or bottle in hand.

> How to avoid being arrested: If you choose to drink, do it at a local establishment, hotel room, or at home before and after the game. If you are attending a Gator party at a friend's house or apartment, make sure to stay within the property's boundaries at all times.

Remember 3 things: 1. Do not drink and drive. 2. It is illegal to have an open container on the streets of Gainesville.

Florida leads the country in running red lights!



Florida leads the nation in red-light running according to last year's Stop on Red Week sponsored by the National Coalition for Safer Roads and the Federal Highway Administration's statistics.

According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, running red lights or other traffic controls is the most common cause of all urban auto accidents.

In addition, according to the Federal Highway Administration, 93% of drivers believe running a red light is unacceptable, yet 1 in 3 drivers reported doing so in the past 30 days.

Statistics also show that Florida drivers committed the most red-light violations on Fridays and the least on Sundays. The hours between 1 p.m. – 5 p.m. have the highest rate of running a red light in Florida. Fourth of July weekend had the highest number of violations in Florida with Labor Day Weekend, Super Bowl Sunday, and Memorial Day following close behind.

What is running a red light? You are running a red light if your vehicle enters an intersection anytime after the signal light has turned red. Even though National Stop on Red Week was celebrated last month, please help spread the word about the importance of stopping on red every time and day of the year. It just may save your life or the life of a loved one.

Case of the month—Investigation, Persistence, and Determination Pay Off!

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
